Rondavels are round houses that are popular in southern Africa. The roofs of rondavel houses are thatched and dome-shaped.

The rondavel is small and usually has just one open room. Sunlight enters into the rondavel from the main doorway.

People construct rondavels in a few different ways. One way to build a rondavel is to weave sticks or reeds into a large cylinder shape. This shape is then filled with mud, which will harden after drying out in the sun. Another way to construct a rondavel is to plant wooden poles in a circle and then fill the spaces with mud.



# Korowai Tree Houses in Indonesia

Can you imagine living in a tree house? In Indonesia, there is a tribe called the Korowai that lives in tree houses in the jungle!

There are a few reasons why the Korowai live high above the ground. The first reason is that it is a tradition. The second reason is that it helps the Korowai escape annoying bugs. Mosquitoes usually fly close to the ground, so these tree houses are usually free from pesky mosquitoes.

A large tree trunk serves as the main pole that supports the tree house. Smaller wooden poles are placed under each corner of the house. The five poles support the house so that it does not fall. A whole family, including their pets, live in the house. So it is very important that the tree house is sturdy.

There is always the danger of a fire burning down the house, however. The Korowai have to be careful when they cook food. Playing in the kitchen is definitely not allowed!




